CELEBRATING GOVERNANCE

My name is Katie Brown and I chair the Local Academy Committee (LAC) at Hall Meadow Primary School. The Local Academy Committee is

a sub-committee of the InMAT trust board and has a number of delegated responsibilities that support the school as well as deliver assurance on key priority areas.

The work of the LAC is broad and varied and covers all aspects of the school community. Some examples of areas that we are responsible for monitoring are:

- School improvement and standards
- Effectiveness of safeguarding and ensuring compliance with national guidance
- Evaluating the effectiveness of the curriculum
- SEND, pupil premium and inclusion

We also have a role in promoting partnership working between all key stakeholders.

Recently we have been looking in detail at areas of the curriculum particularly science, computing, PE and writing, to gain an understanding on how this is taught within Hall Meadow and its effectiveness in relation to the children's progress and attainment. This has included meeting with the members of staff responsible for those areas of curriculum as well as seeing these in action within the school. We also had a key role in the recent OFSTED inspection and have been talking to children and staff about the new Expectations Policy.

One of the highlights of being a governor is the opportunity to spend time with the children and talk to them about school life. This forms a really important part of the assurance and oversight of the LAC's role.

Every governor brings different skills from their career and life experience which are valuable in contributing to the LAC's work. For anything specifically relating to education, training is provided. SAFER INTERNET DAY

TOP TIPS FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

These top tips have been written for you to help you support your child to stay safe and happy online. This Safer Internet Day make space for...

MAKE SPACE FOR REGULAR CONVERSATIONS ABOUT LIFE ONLINE

Talk openly and frequently about what you are doing online and encourage your child to do the same. Talk about the positive experiences you can have online, share what you have done when you have come across content you did not want to, and how you dealt with the situation.

MAKE SPACE FOR ENJOYING AND EXPLORING THE ONLINE WORLD TOGETHER!

Play games, watch videos, and express an interest in your child's online life. Celebrate all the opportunities that technology has to offer, and show them what a great space the internet can be when used responsibly.

MAKE SPACE FOR WORKING AS A FAMILY TO AGREE EXPECTATIONS FOR GOING ONLINE

Talk to your family about the role technology plays in your lives. Establish rules and expectations that encourage meaningful use of technology, in the same way you set boundaries in other areas of your children's lives. It's important to review these regularly and adapt them for each member of your family.

MAKE SPACE FOR LEARNING ABOUT THE APPS, GAMES AND WEBSITES YOUR CHILD IS USING

There are lots of tools and guides to support you with keeping your child safe on whatever apps, games and websites they are using. Research age ratings, privacy settings, and safety features (like the block and report button) so that you are best placed to help your child should anything go wrong.

MAKE SPACE FOR SUPPORTING AND REASSURING YOUR CHILD IF THINGS GO WRONG

Remind your child they can talk to you about anything. If something goes wrong, listen and respond with reassurance and kindness and stay calm. Work with your child to find solutions to the problem, perhaps by using the block and report tools or seeking advice from your child's school.

HMPS CELEBRATE 'GOOD' OFSTED REPORT

'Pupils learn to do what is right, what is kind and what is safe at this inclusive, happy school.' This is what the OFSTED team gleaned from their two-day, full inspection at Hall Meadow Primary School.

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During the two-day inspection in December, no part of school was left unseen. The inspectors met with staff, children, the LAC, Trustees, the InMAT CEO and school improvement lead and parents. From these discussions along with learning walks observing phonics, maths, reading in KS2, writing, Science, PE, History, PSHE, French, computing and peer massage as well as EYFS the overall judgement was 'Good'. 'Leaders are highly ambitious that all pupils will achieve well. Pupils enjoy their lessons. They are eager to learn.'

The inspectors were impressed with the early reading programme in place and the effectiveness of the interventions to support pupils to develop confidence in reading and fluency.

From discussions with pupils they found that; 'They love visitors coming to visit the...they run book clubs and times tables clubs...they said they feel welcome and safe.' The OFSTED team saw the strong relationships between the whole school community and emphasised that 'pupils behave well and work hard.' They noted the care they show to one another when they are having fun at playtimes and how the older children look after the younger ones.

Staff supported this by saying they are proud and happy to work at Hall Meadow Primary School. They support the leaders' ambition.

Safeguarding was deemed effective with a culture of care and vigilance. Pupils know they can talk to adults about their worries and they trust the adults will keep them safe.

The whole school community was delighted that the report reflected the continued development and improvements across the school over the past two years. All feel it is a true reflection of where the school is at and the next steps.
